Proficiency Standards and Frameworks: A Practical Overview

As Indonesia, and the wider East Asia region, continues to incorporate the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) within education reform, the British Council has developed this workshop to outline the development, purpose and impact of the CEFR and to illustrate how it supports and connects the work of English language teachers, curriculum developers and test designers worldwide. Participants will gain an insight into how the descriptors, scales and related tools in the CEFR are used to place language tests, learner proficiency and learner progress onto a common "roadmap" and how this can help enhance learning efficacy and motivation in the local context.

Participants will:

- gain an understanding of the development, purpose and impact of the CEFR
- explore the definition of language proficiency and how the CEFR measures it
- evaluate how using CEFR illustrative scales can enhance teaching and testing purposes
- consider how to use the CEFR selectively to support their local language context
